May	22	Wed	Nrsimha Chaturdasi Vratam Vaisnavanam (Appearance of Lord Nrsimhadeva) (Fasting from all grains and beans and breaking fast on the next day) The Agama Sastra states, VAISNAVAIR NA TU KARTAVYA SMARA-VIDDHA CHATURSADI, Vaisnavas should not observe Nrsimha Chaturdasi fast on that day if that day is combined with the previous day (i.e. mixed with trayodasi). Vaisnavas should observe only the pure and unmixed chaturdasi fast.

Aug.	19	Mon	Purnima (Full moon day, The Lord's swing festival of Lord Sri Sri Radha Govindaji ends on this day), Raksabandhanam, tying of Raakhee after 13:15 (due to inauspicious moments of bhadra the festival of tying Raakhee can only be held after 1:15 p.m. on this day).
Aug.	27	Tue	Sri Krsna Janmastami Vratam Vaisnavanam (Fasting for Lord Krsna's appearance day, breaking the fast on next day)
Aug.	28	Wed	Nandotsava, appearance day of Srila Prabhupada, Festival for Srila Prabhupada's disciples. (Fasting till noon for Srila Prabhupada's disciples and then feasting)
Aug.	30	Fri	Aja Ekadasi Vratam Vaisnavanam (Breaking the fast on the next day)
Sept.	03	Tue	Amavasya (new moon day)
Sept.	07	Sat	Ganesha Chaturthi, Vedic scriptures forbid looking at moon at night on this day.
Sept.	11	Wed	Radhastami (appearance day of Srimati Radharani) (Fasting till noon and then feasting, with kirtan-bhajan and offering Haluva, Pooris and subji to Srimati Radharani and Lord Krsna and then honoring the prasadam along with congregational devotees)
Sept.	14	Sat	Parivartini Ekadasi Vratam (Breaking the Ekadasi fast on the next day) Yogurt and buttermilk fast ends here and the fasting from drinking milk begins on this day for next 30 days).
Sept.	18	Wed	Purnima (full moon day)
Sept.	28	Sat	Indira Ekadasi Vratam Sarvesam (Breaking the fast on the next day)
Oct.	02	Wed	Amavasya (new moon day)

Oct.	12	Sat	Dasahara, Vijaya Dasami, Day of Lord Rama's victory over Ravana. Sripada Madhvacharya's appearance day.
Oct.	14	Mon	Papankusa Ekadasi Vratam Vaisnavanam (Breaking the fast on the next day) Milk fast ends on this day and the fasting from all kinds of nuts and beans begin from this day for next 30 days. Eggplants (bringal) and gur (raw sugar or brown sugar or anything that includes molasses) cannot be consumed in this month. Taking a vow for the Kartika month begins on this day. Akasha Deepa Danam (offering of ghee lamp) and the singing of Damodarastam along with Vrajaraja-Sutastakam begins on this day for next 30 days.
Oct.	17	Thu	Sharadiya Purnima (Lord Krsna's Rasalila day) on this day Lord Krsna is offered a grand quantity of sweet rice at moonrise)
Oct.	24	Thu	Radhakunda Snana just after the midnight
Oct.	28	Mon	Rama Ekadasi Vratam Sarvesam (Breaking the fast on the next day)
Nov.	01	Fri	Deepavali (festival of lamps in India) (Laksmi Poojan) Skanda Purana it is stated, BHUTA-VIDDHA TU AMAVASYA NA GRAHYA MUNI-PUNGAVAIH, all the sages and saints have stated that if Amavasya is mixed with previous day (i.e. combined with chaturdasi) should not be accepted.

Nov	05	Tue	Kartika sukla Chaturthi; Srila Prabhupada's disappearance day (fasting till noon and then feasting for Srila Prabhupada's disciples)
Nov.	10	Sun	Aksyaya Navami (Mathura-Vrindaban Parikrama, twin circumambulation)
Nov.	11	Mon	Bhisma Panchaka starts on this day.
Nov.	12	Tue	Haribodhini Ekadasi Vratam (Breaking the fast on the next day. On this day Lord Krsna is offered ghee lamp kept on a pealed piece of sugarcane)

Following of Kartika vow ends on the next day) Deva Deepaavali (as there is a fifteen day difference in ours and their day's calculation that is why the demigods in heaven celebrate this festival of lamps as an offering for Lord Rama's arrival at Ayodhya)

March	05	Wed	Brahmotsava of Lord Sri Sri Radha Govindadevaji. Festival held at the Red Stone temple, in Sri Vrindaban Dham, India.
March.	10	Mon	Amalaki Ekadasi Vratam Sarvesam (Breaking the fast on the next day) Festival of colors begins in the temples in Sri Vrindaban Dham which lasts till the full moon day)
March	13	Thu	Holikadaha, burning of Holika at after 10.35 in the evening.
March	14	Fri	Gaura Purnima (full moon day, Appearance Day of Lord Sri Chaitanya Mahaprabhu, fasting from all grains and beans on this day and the braking the fast on the next day morning. On this day, Holi festival (festival of colors) is held in India. The service of color festival in the temples in Vrindaban ends on this day.)
